I have now had the Blade 350 QX for a month now and I have enjoyed every flight. Some folks have had propeller issues, but most have not. If your propellers do not have a B on them, Horizon will send you replacements for free. The guad is so stable in safe mode that I let my 6 year old take the sticks for a bit. It is a pretty steady platform for shooting video with your GoPro that mounts to the bottom. I have not had the courage to fly much in agility mode as my interest in this is in aerial videography not aerobatics. If you had been eyeballing the DJI Phantom but didn't want to drop the money on it, this is the way to go, plus if you already use Spektrum, there is a BNF option.

Speaking of Spektrum, my next quick review will be on the new Spektrum DX9. The main feature I would like to explore is the wireless buddybox. It allows you to wirelessly connect to anyone else using a 2.4ghz Spektrum system, regardless of model.
