IMAC CORNER by Gary A Valenzuela

It's not to late to sign up for the 2nd Annual Mason Dixon Shootout IMAC contest. The event will be held at the Fredericksburg Area Radio Control Club which is located in Spotsylvania, VA. Does flying inverted make those knees knock? Does incorrect rudder input make you shy away from flying inverted? I'm sure it does for everyone. Here are a three tips that has helped me in the Intermediate IMAC sequences. Tip 1: When flying upright and looking at the nose of the airplane move the rudder stick in the direction you want the nose to go. While flying inverted fly the tail. Move the rudder stick in the direction you need the tail to go. You will notice how easy it becomes with some practice. A good maneuver to practice is the hammer head with the belly facing you. This will force you to use that rudder input on the up lines. Tip 2: When starting a roll upright, the rudder and aileron will move in opposite directions (right roll needs left rudder), when starting a roll from the inverted, the rudder and aileron will move in the SAME directions (right roll needs right rudder). Make sense? Tip 3: Learning to fly inverted is also easier if you throttle back to a more moderate airspeed. Not only will you have more time to think, but a lower airspeed also will require you to push more forward-elevator to hold the plane level and thus provide a greater range of feel for the elevator. After a while it will become a natural stick input. Remember to fly a few mistakes higher while learning any maneuver.

As spring arrives and you want to get out and fly take the time to do the following: Before packing up those planes make sure you preflight check your planes and equipment. Check all components thoroughly. One of the most important components to check are your batteries. If you didn't storage charge your batteries during the winter months then I would highly recommend running those batteries through a few cycles if your charger will support. I use the Hitec X4 Plus, 4 port, AC/DC Multi-Charger. This charger has a Cyclic Charging / Discharging feature that is perfect. However, If you believe those batteries are old or just not comfortable please just buy new ones. This will save your airframe and most importantly provide a safe environment for you and club members at the field. While that cowl is off it's also a good time to replace those CM6 plugs for those standard DLE and DA engines. Double check all tygon fuel lines and connections. Ensure that tygon pickup line in the fuel tank moves freely and haven't become stiff. There are other areas that should be checked as well but the above mentioned should get you started. Remember, It ain't fun if you ain't Low!
